• **Club meetings** are held at 7:00PM on the 4th Tuesday of the months September-June, at Algonquin College, Craig St. Perth.

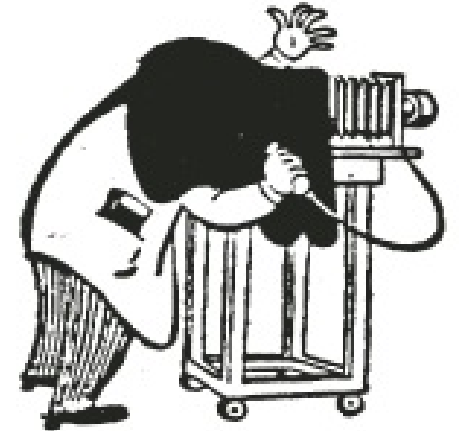
• **A monthly e-mail** outlining coming events is sent to all members advising of guest speaker/topic or workshop and a monthly photo theme.

Regular Meetings:

An attempt is made to offer all club members an entertaining and instructive program at each meeting. These include guest speakers, special slide presentations, hands-on learning experiences, and evaluation sessions. A bit of a business session is also a feature of regular monthly meetings.

Guest Speakers:

The club invites numerous guest speakers to present at the regular meetings. These presentations provide members great sources of inspiration, technical expertise and additional motivation. Past speakers have included local artists, professional photographers and industry experts. At the next regular meeting, a panel of judges award points to each image and winners are announced and lavished with glorious prizes.

Field Trips:

One of the highlights of any Camera Club activities is field trips. Recent field trips have been outdoor oriented as well as studio based. Always popular, these events offer a great opportunity for practical experience and some great camaraderie with a group of like minded friends.

Digital Group:

For the new photographer, this group uses hands-on workshops to examine various photographic techniques focussing on the capabilities of digital technology. Meetings occur on the first Tuesday of the month, September to June.
